Japanese Iris with Patrick Spence

We are pleased to welcome Patrick Spence as our speaker for January. He and his wife Margaret own Cascadia Iris Garden in Lake Stevens, Washington. The topic will be Japanese Iris. He will explore the past, present, and future of the Imperial Iris. The Japanese Iris has been in cultivation for over 600 years. We will learn the history of this iris from Feudal Japan to modern day and take a look at where modern hybridizers are trying to go next.

Cascadia Iris Gardens is a commercial nursery featuring the genus iris. Set on 5 acres in Lake Stevens, WA, it has an ever expanding series of display beds used to demonstrate how irises can be a focal point in any perennial border. The stated goal is to showcase how you can use iris to achieve year 'round bloom in your garden. The reality is that they just love plants of all types and use the display beds as an excuse to add as many unusual plants as possible.

Patrick is the Immediate Past President of the King County Iris Society, as well as Immediate Past President of The Society for Japanese Iris, and President of the Society for Siberian Iris. Margaret is a director for the King County Iris Society and the Editor of The Review, the twice-yearly publication for the Society for Japanese Iris. Both are accredited iris judges through the American Iris Society.



Iris January Culture

We have had a very dry winter so far. This gives us the perfect opportunity to work in our gardens. The irises are mostly dormant and the beds should be free of weeds and all dead leaves need to be removed. The irises start to grow in February and that will be the time to fertilize the bearded iris with a generous handful of balanced fertilizer such as 10-10-10 or 12-12-12. Even 16-16-16 works; just use less of it. The fertilizer will need to be scratched in around the outside edges of the plants and then watered in if it is not raining. The fertilizer needs to get down to the iris roots so it takes about three weeks to do its magic. Early February is the time to fertilizer in our area. Aim to be finished by Valentine's Day at the latest. Meanwhile, weed!


