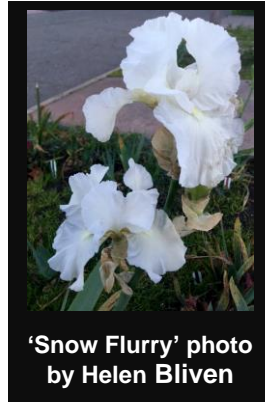

Minutes

CBRIS Meeting, January 7, 2022

President Carol Dahout called the meeting to order at 7:30. There were 29 members on the call. Guests: Debbie Cole (PCI friend of Gary Knipe) and Mike Mace.

Program: Moraea, the “Peacock Iris” of South Africa

Mike Mace gave a presentation on Moraea. He was intrigued by Moraea when he read about them in a book called All About Bulbs and began hybridizing them. Moraea grow in South Africa, which has a Mediterranean climate. The flowers are flat and often have a colorful center. The male pollinators rest on the flowers, whose colors attract the females. There are over 200 species of Moraea, all of which inter-breed. Mike does about 300 crosses a year in 13 raised beds. He showed us pictures of some of his hybrids. He has been working on flowers with single or double centers and different color combinations. Much information about Moraea can be found at the website <https://growingcoolplants.blogspot.com>.

Garry Knipe, who started his own Moraea hybridizing program after meeting Mike, spoke about his work with Moraea and cultivation. Moraea grow from corms. The leaves can be 2 feet tall. The flowers 1.5 to 2 inches across and can last 4 to 5 days. Moraea require good drainage and regular watering during the growing season but not during the summer. They like dappled shade. Gary’s hybridizing goals are currently wider flowers and bright colors and eyes with contrasting border.

CBRIS Iris Show: Carol will check with Westgate about having the show there.

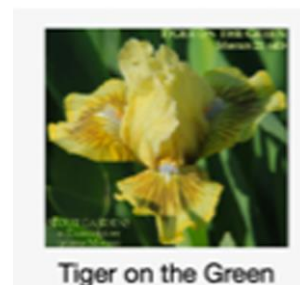
Spring Regional: Still scheduled for April 30 - May 1. Plans are pending Covid situation.

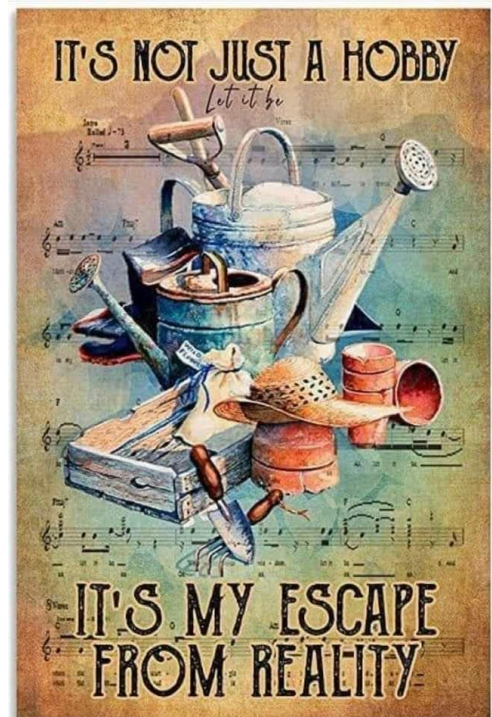

Culture

No more garden rest for your irises nor you! A balanced fertilizer should be applied now before the spring rush of growth. 10-10-10, 12-12-12, or 15-15-15. Just use a bit less, the higher the number. Scratch granular fertilizer into soil, but not so deep as to do root damage. Watering will need to be done if the winter rains do not cooperate.

If you are worried about leaf spot, spray general-purpose fungicide for leaf spot now before main growth occurs, repeat in two weeks if the problem was bad last year.

Start weeding and consider applying a pre-emergent herbicide before warmer weather and rapid weed growth.

Re-apply mulch around beardless iris.
