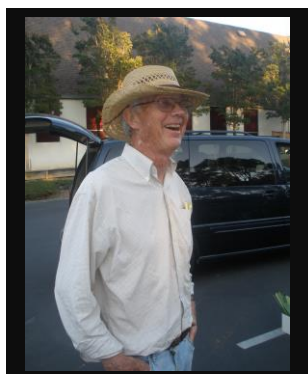

Remembering Jack Alvis



Jack was recently transported on the wings of angels to a tranquil place where he no longer has to rely on a cane, a walker or a wheelchair, but once again stands tall and strong, tending his gardens with firm and steady steps, and a clear mind, inviting one and all to share the joy of his iris. With his ready smile and friendly demeanor, he will greet all visitors as they admire his garden full of perfectly branched iris with prolific blossoms of Heavenly colors.

Jack Malcolm Alvis, 94 years young, passed away in the early morning hours on Tuesday, February 21, 2022, at home in the care of his devoted daughter Joann and loving wife of 70 years and 10 months, Philippa, from complications of Aspiration Pneumonia and Covid. which he fought with courage until his final breath.

Jack was born on December 10, 1927, in a two-room log home in the tiny community of St. John, North Dakota, the first child of George W. and Gladys M. (Irwin) Alvis who farmed and raised sheep on their land. This is where Jack spent his boyhood along with three more siblings. As a result of strep and Scarlet Fever, which left Jack with a damaged heart, the family migrated to the warmer climate of Texas for Jack's health. There his dad operated a Gulf gas station. With the onset of World War II, the family packed up once again following his dad's jobs at various government construction sites, ultimately putting down roots in Vancouver, Washington, working in the Kaiser shipyards. Jack attended Vancouver High School and also worked a Swing Shift job after classes to support the war effort.

After graduation in 1946, Jack attended Clark College where he reconnected with his future wife, Philippa Mourton, a high school friend of his sister. And the rest is history! Jack and Philippa married in 1951, both became teachers, and moved again for better weather to San Jose in 1960 with their two young children, Bradley and Joann. A second daughter, Melissa, joined the family in 1964,



After retirement from teaching for San Jose Unified School District, Jack returned to his love of farming and became an avid gardener joining the Clara B. Rees Iris Society in 1984 and planting his Alvis Iris Garden at his Monte Sereno mini-farm.

Our deepest condolences to Philippa and family. Jack will be greatly missed.



Minutes

CBRIS Meeting, March 4, 2022

President Carol Dahout called the meeting to order at 7:36. There were 23 members on the call.

Announcement: Carol announced the deaths of two CBRIS members, Jack Alvis and Pat Hawkins. She also announced the death of Jeanne Clay Plank, a former president of the American Iris Society. CBRIS members voted to donate \$150 to Region 14 in their memory.

Program:

Carol and Trang put together a presentation on Clara B. Rees and 'Snow Flurry'.

Clara B. Rees is famous for her hybrid, 'Snow Flurry', a parent of all the modern tall bearded irises. Clara, born in 1879, lived in Ohio, where she worked as a bookkeeper and grew tulips as a hobby. In 1925, she and her sister, Ruth, moved to the Santa Clara Valley. The valley was too warm for tulips, so Clara turned to hybridizing amaryllis, lilies, and iris. Trying to create a pink iris, Clara crossed 'Thais' and 'Purissima'. This cross produced only two seeds, which Clara planted. 'Snow Flurry', a white ruffled iris on good tall stalks was the result. The second year 'Snow Flurry' bloomed, Ruth took it to Carl Salbach, a leading hybridizer. Salbach visited the Rees garden the next day and bought all the rhizomes but one of 'Snow Flurry' for \$150. Clara kept one rhizome on the condition that she not sell 'Snow Flurry' for three years. Salbach introduced it in her name in 1939. Clara was awarded the AIS Hybridizer's Medal in 1967. She died in 1970.

Carol also displayed pictures of the children of 'Snow Flurry' and other irises that Clara hybridized.

Business Meeting

Linda Stremel reminded the members of the judges' training session on PCIs on March 26.

The club has to donate a basket for the Spring Regional. Mary will coordinate.

Spring Regional on April 30 at Dry Creek. April 15 is the deadline to register. Jeff is looking for weeding volunteers, as there are still 10 beds to weed.

6. Summer picnic

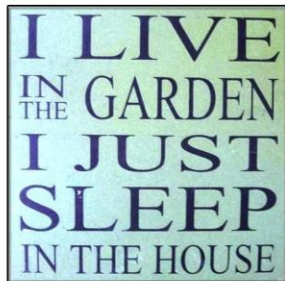
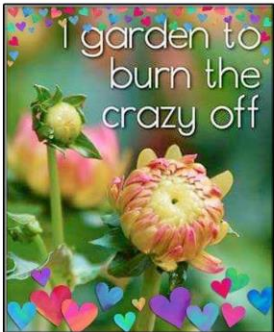
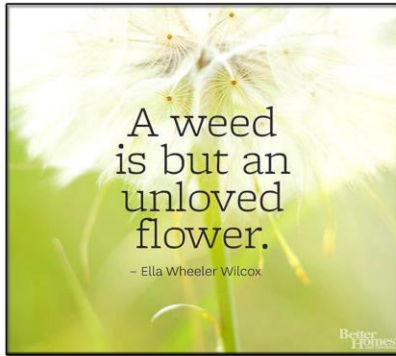
Location of picnic was discussed. Ortega Park chosen again as the most centrally located. Elaine will make reservation.

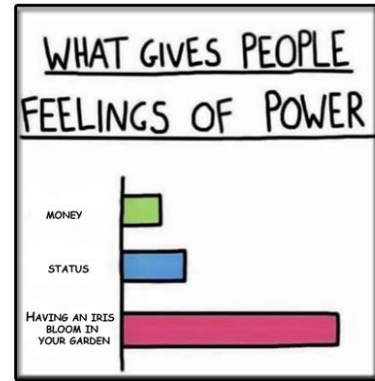
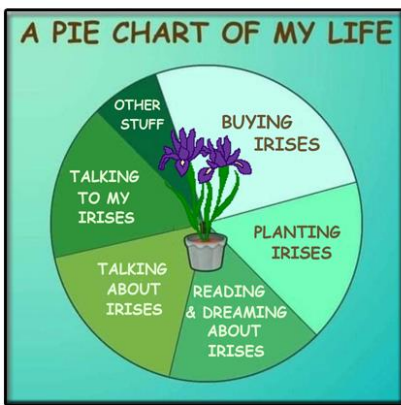
7. Contribution to AIS scholarship fund for floriculture or horticulture student.

Culture

Bloom time has begun here in the Santa Clara Valley! Yes, a bit early and ever so welcomed. This is the right time to check on your irises to make certain that they have the proper names on them. Update your garden map. Be careful while weeding or watering as those bloom stalks can snap off.

Please enter some blooms at the iris shows. Mount Diablo has theirs on April 9 at Alden Lane Nursery in Livermore. Monterey Bay will be holding theirs in the London Nelson Center in Santa Cruz on April 23. Both are fairly close and easy drives. Hopefully, we will hold a show next year.

Your Louisiana and Japanese irises need more water than the bearded. Give them water if you want more spectacular blooms after the tall bearded are finished blooming.

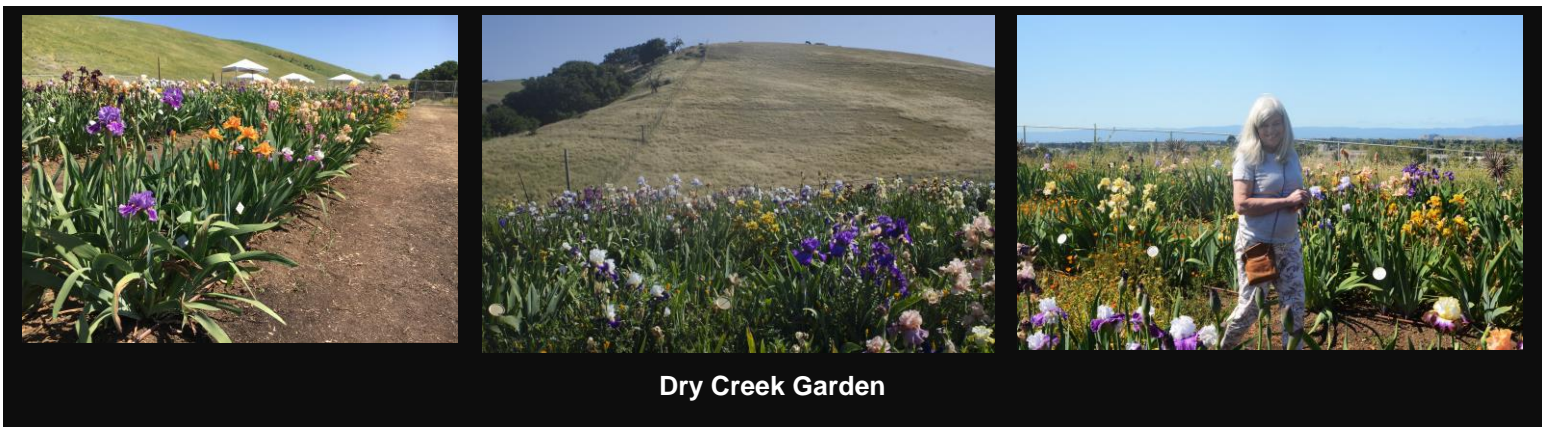
