CBRIS Board Meeting August 26, 2022

Review and Discussion of Proposed Budget

Line 1A. Christmas Party: The budget for Christmas Party has been increased from last year.

Line 8. Pots and Potting Mix: We didn't spend much on pots this year because we had some left over from last year, but will need to buy more next year.

Line 16. AIS and Region 14 Membership These fees were higher this year because last year's and this year's were paid together this year.

Line 4A. Club Purchased Bearded Iris It was suggested that door prize rhizomes be purchased from a wider selection of hybridizers. Currently, the club's goal is to provide 20 door prizes per meeting, so the club is buying from growers who offer club discounts, a policy which enabled the club to only spend \$1,049 to buy iris retailing for \$2,800. If the club were to change that policy and buy from more expensive growers, it would either have to buy fewer rhizomes or allocate more money for door prizes. We could offer fewer door prizes per meeting to save money - members shouldn't expect that they'll each win a door prize every meeting. This issue should be discussed by the general membership and they should be polled about which growers' iris they would like to have as door prizes.

Budget was approved for presentation to the general membership.

Elections of Officers

Carol, Trang, Mary, and Andrea have agreed to be President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary respectively for second terms.

Shirley, Riley, and Alice are terming out as Directors. Jane and Ken Reiter have volunteered to step in as directors. It would be good to involve new members as directors. Linda Lomperis volunteered to be a director.

Spring Show

We can do our spring show at the West Valley Library at no charge. They can provide tables. We can do the show on April 22, 2023 and have the pot sale on April 29 at the West Valley Farmer's Market.

Donation to Dry Creek

Motion was moved and seconded to donate \$500 to Dry Creek iris Garden subject to approval by club members at next meeting.

Roster and Dues

Carol will send out new membership roster. 50% of our club members still owe dues.

Basket for Spring Regional

Theme for the basket will be birds. Mikey and Jane J. will work on basket.

Christmas Party

Christmas party will be on December 2 at the Blue Pheasant.

Scholarship Recipient Profile



Meet Jessica Vanden Beukel, this year's top AIS Region 14 scholarship winner.

Jessica is currently a junior attending Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo and majoring in landscape architecture. She is a San Jose native with deep ties to the Bay Area and the CBRIS organization. Here are excerpts from a recent interview with Jessica.

Q. How did you first become interested in gardening? **A.** *Watching my mom and also my grandmother (Elaine Fischer) grow iris in their gardens sparked my interest in iris and the landscaping world. I've participated in several iris shows in the youth category and remember framing my first blue ribbon. My grandma taught me how to care for iris and I learned how to trim and divide in her Sunnyvale garden.*

Q. Why did you choose the Cal Poly Landscape Architecture program & what makes it special? **A.** *It's one of the best programs in the country and has a "Learn by doing" motto. It's very hands-on and you immediately take classes in your major vs. doing mostly General Ed for two years. In my time at school so far, I've had the chance to design real life projects for the City of Buellton and Las Vegas, as well as the opportunity to experience sand dune habitat restoration projects first hand from CA State Park Officials.*

Q. What are your plans after graduation? **A.** *After I complete my degree and receive my license, I hope to work at a firm that shares my values on the environment and community. I have always aspired to create public spaces that are both educational and beneficial to the community; I think creating landscapes that are both environmentally and socially beneficial should not be an aspiration but a requirement. I hope the landscapes I design become well-loved spaces that are environmentally sensitive while educating the community about sustainability and nature.*

Q. What opportunities have you had so far to work on landscaping or public space projects? **A.** *When I was a junior at Pioneer High School I designed & painted the murals for two campus electrical boxes. I also participated in the Redwood City Magical Bridge project (an all-abilities park initiative.) I did a coyote mosaic as part of a larger mosaic mural at the park entrance. At Cal Poly I've worked on both campus and nearby community landscape projects.*

Q. When you're not gardening or studying what are you up to? **A.** *Taking care of my houseplants, dancing with the United Movement club at Cal Poly, hanging out with friends.*

Favorite garden product or hack? *"Odlá" - Ikea potting medium. The clay pebbles are great for moisture retention with potted plants.*

Current favorite iris or one you hope to add to your collection? *Prairie Splendor*

Culture

How are your irises? Do they need dividing?

Have you planted your door prize irises yet?

Now is the time to finish this garden duty.



1. Lift clumps of iris carefully using a pitch fork or shovel
2. Shake off loose soil
3. Separate individual rhizomes by pulling apart or cutting
4. Remove damaged leaves, trim remaining leaves to about a six-inch height, trim roots
5. Soak rhizomes in a bleach bath (one part bleach to nine parts water) for 10-15 minutes. Rinse well.
6. Allow rhizomes to dry completely in the shade.
7. Prepare the bed by adding compost and a small handful of even numbered fertilizer.
8. Replant by preparing a shallow hole with a low mound in the center. Place the rhizome on the mound, spread the roots down the mound into the surrounding trench
9. Fill the hole, leaving the top of the rhizome barely covered with soil
10. Tamp the soil down and water thoroughly.
11. Water about twice a week until the rhizome shows new growth or hopefully the winter rains take over.
12. Make certain that your irises are labelled and it is good to keep a map. Keep the weeds away!

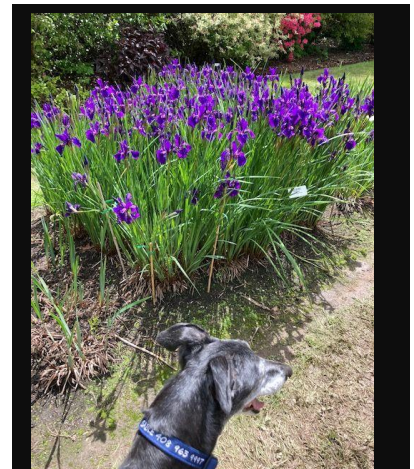

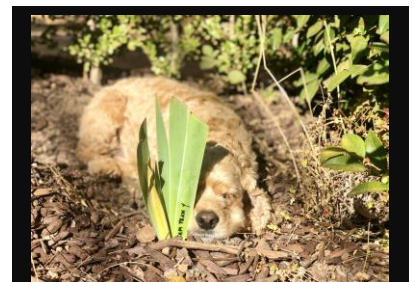
