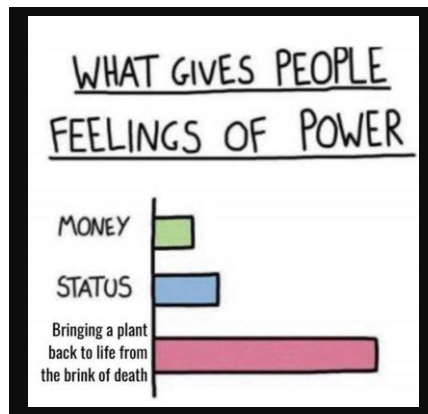

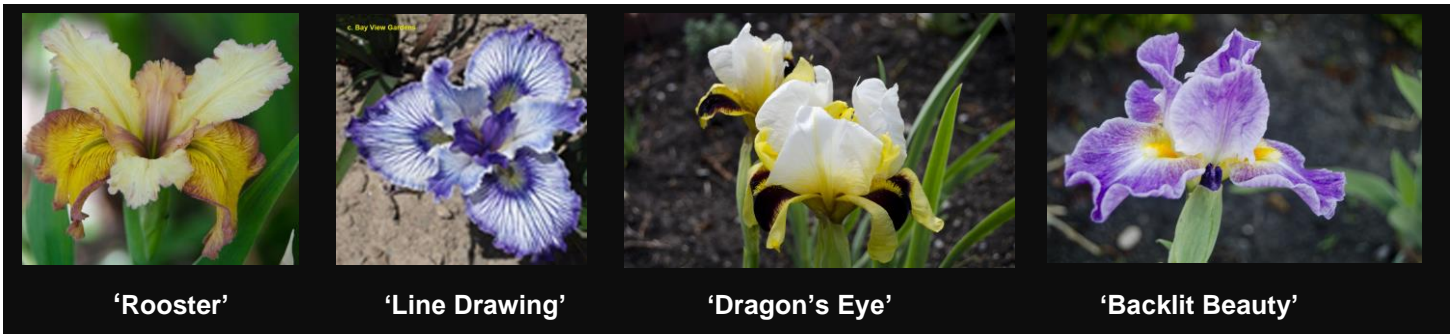

August Culture

It is time to get those bearded iris into the ground if you have not done so. You want them to settle in and start rooting before any hard freeze. Try adding some compost for better draining soil and a bit of fertilizer (even numbered such as 10x10x10) for better growth and larger blooms. Remember that they like at least six hours of sun and not to be planted too deep. Water the irises twice a week until you see new growth of leaves coming up from the middle. After that, the rhizomes like to be more on the dry side except for winter rains.

Irises need good air circulation so keep those weeds away from the rhizomes. You can try using Preen if you want any help with your weed prevention.

Not replanting? There is still garden work to do. Pull off the old dried leaves. Make sure that all old bloom stalks are cut down.

Too many irises? There are plenty of new club members that will be more than happy to take them! Another idea is to give some rhizomes to a child. Most kids love to have their own plant and watch it grow. Besides these kids are the iris clubs' future.

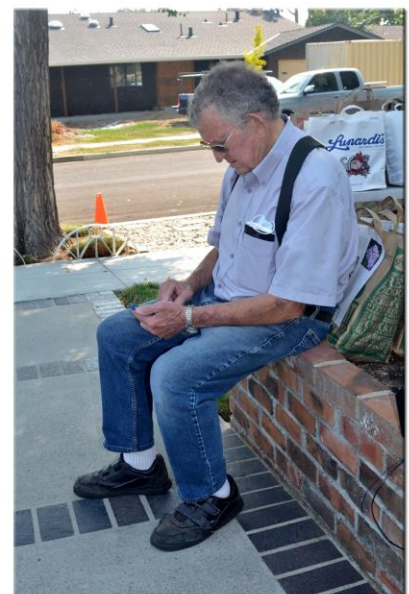
