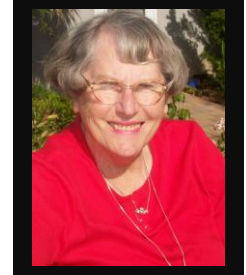

Minutes

CBRIS Meeting, February 4, 2022

President Carol Dahout called the meeting to order at 7:31. There were 27 members on the call. New member: Susan Clark, Guest: Richard Clark

Program: "Beauty from the Past, Preserved for the Future" A Presentation by Wendy Scott, President, Historic Iris Preservation Society (HIPS)

The mission of HIPS is to preserve irises hybridized before 1990. Irises can be lost when gardeners stop growing them or their identification is lost. HIPS encourages the preservation of historic irises through several programs.

HIPS Display Gardens: HIPS members participating in the display garden program grow at least 15 named historic irises. They open their gardens at least once each blooming season. There are 50 display gardens in the US and Canada. Gardens can also have themes - hybridizer, time period, class of irises, award winners, or date range.

Breeder Collections: A Breeder Collection consists of irises that were bred by one person and include at least one iris older than 30 years. The program requires that a Breeder Collector be a HIPS member, report all historic iris holdings to the HIPS databank, and agree to share irises in the collection with other HIPS members.

The Guardian Gardeners program is for experienced iris growers. These growers collect, propagate, and distribute the most endangered iris. They share each other's irises each summer and participate in the HIPS iris sale.

HIPS members can conduct an iris rescue for gardeners who no longer can grow irises and want to preserve their older hybrids. HIPS also offers advice for people who want to bequeath their iris collections.

HIPS is assembling a database of irises that have purple coloration on various parts of the plant.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:25.

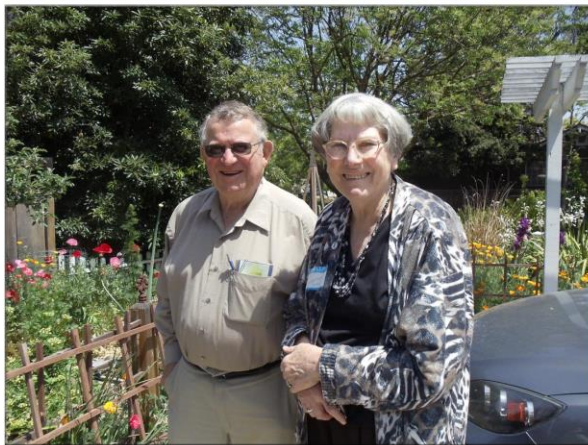

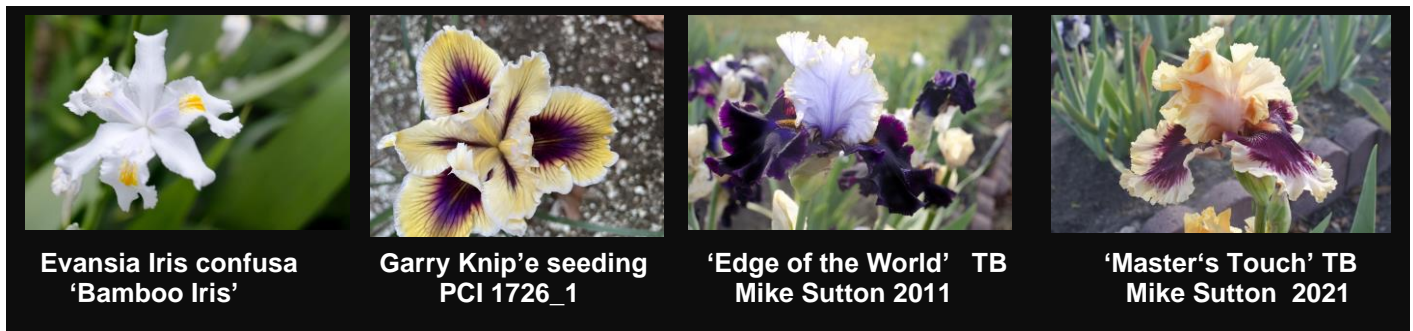

Culture

Keep those weeds down or better yet, out of your iris garden. They compete with the rhizomes for nutrients and water; as well as crowding the irises. Pre-emergent is a great time saver to keep the weeds under control.

With no rainfall, watering is a must if you want any decent stalks. Hopefully, your irises have been fertilized by now. In our area, the recommended date to fertilize is by Feb 14th. The fertilizer needs at least three weeks to work its magic and the growing season has already started.

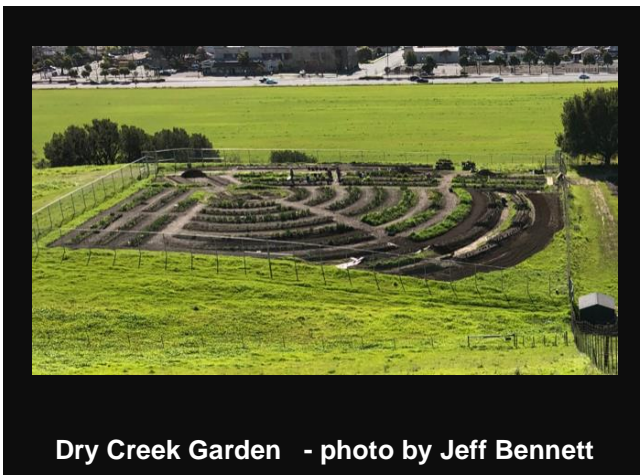

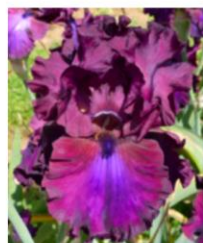
